"EMPOWERING EDUCATORS – COMPETENCY-BASED LEARNING IN THE ENGLISH CLASSROOM"

Purpose of the Workshop:

The workshop titled "Empowering Educators – Competency-Based Learning in the English Classroom" aimed to enhance teachers' understanding of competency-oriented pedagogies and their application in day-to-day English teaching. The session focused on aligning classroom instruction with the National Education Policy (NEP 2020) and the evolving demand for 21st-century skills, ensuring that English language classrooms become more meaningful, engaging, and learner-centered.

Highlights of the Workshop:

The workshop began with an engaging introduction to the core principles of competency-based education (CBE). The resource person explained how English language learning must progress from "knowledge acquisition" to "skills and competencies development".

1. Understanding Competency-Based Learning

Teachers explored the difference between learning outcomes and competencies, how to set measurable, age-appropriate competencies for reading, writing, listening, and speaking, and the need to scaffold learning based on students' readiness, pace, and strengths.

2. Designing Competency-Linked Activities

The session demonstrated practical ways of embedding competencies into English lessons through story-based learning, role-play, vocabulary games, creative writing exercises, and real-world tasks such as posters, group presentations, and peer reviews.

3. Assessment in a CBE English Classroom

Focus was placed on formative assessments, rubrics for speaking and writing, reading fluency checklists, and portfolio-based assessment.

4. Inclusion and Differentiation

The workshop highlighted strategies for differentiated tasks, supporting SEDG groups, and using visual aids to enhance comprehension.

5. Integrating Technology

Teachers explored digital tools for interactive reading, storytelling, vocabulary enhancement, and formative assessments.

Interactive Sessions and Teacher Participation:

Educators participated enthusiastically in discussions, lesson planning tasks, activity demonstrations, and designing competency-based worksheets. Innovative classroom strategies were shared, enhancing collaborative professional learning.

Conclusion:

The workshop empowered teachers to redesign English classroom practices in alignment with competency-based learning. It reinforced the importance of joyful learning, real-life communication, and meaningful learning outcomes.

Reflections:

Teachers reflected on the need to shift to skill-driven learning, provide continuous feedback, and adopt inclusive and student-centered methodologies, strengthening their commitment to competency-driven English classrooms.
