



Code of Conduct for Students

At our school, we believe in creating a safe, respectful, and happy learning environment. To achieve this, we expect every student to behave in a responsible and considerate way.

Acts that are considered inappropriate:

- Showing disrespect or misbehaviour towards teachers, staff, or classmates.
- Intentionally disturbing classes or being absent without permission.
- Bullying, intimidating, or teasing others in any form.
- Misbehaviour towards girl students.
- Damaging, scribbling on, or misusing school property.
- Encouraging strikes or disrupting normal school activities.
- Being part of banned or harmful groups.
- Promoting discrimination, communal or caste-based feelings.
- Using physical violence or hurting others.
- Disobeying instructions given by teachers, Headmistress, Vice Principal, or Principal.
- Bringing unauthorized people or objects into the school.
- Stealing or mishandling belongings of the school or other students.
- Using inappropriate or offensive language.
- Engaging in behaviour that is not respectful or responsible.
- Indulging in morally inappropriate activities.
- Using drugs, alcohol, or any prohibited substances.

Actions that may be taken if rules are broken:

- A gentle reminder or written note to the student (and if needed, to parents) to help correct behaviour.
- Temporary withdrawal from classes or school activities so the student can reflect and improve.
- Requesting the student to help repair or contribute towards the cost of any damages caused.
- Guidance to move to another school if the situation cannot be resolved within the present environment.
- In very serious situations, permanent separation from the school as a last resort.

Purpose of the Code of Conduct

- To encourage students to be disciplined, responsible, and respectful.
- To ensure safety and fairness for every learner and staff member.
- To maintain the school's integrity and provide a positive, peaceful atmosphere.
- To help students clearly understand what behaviour is expected of them and the values we stand for.
