#### **Historical Crisis Committee (HCC)**

#### **International Press (IP)**

#### United Nations Security Council (UNSC)

Day Two was marked by urgent deliberations as delegates responded to ongoing crises. Realtime updates challenged their adaptability, leading to resolutions on ceasefires, humanitarian aid corridors, and sanctions. The session closed with a united call for transparent mediation and preventive diplomacy to safeguard civilians and uphold global stability.



#### United Nations General Assembly (UNGA)

On Day Two, diplomacy intensified as delegates finalized draft resolutions on nuclear disarmament. With alliances firm and discussions focused on practical implementation, the committee passed two working papers emphasizing treaty ratification, global accountability, and arms inspections. The session concluded with strong consensus for moving beyond deterrence toward true disarmament.



### United Nations Human Righhts Council (UNHRC)

Day Two marked a collaborative shift as delegates finalized policies to protect civilian rights in conflict zones. Key measures included the formation of monitoring task forces, implementation of digital rights reporting, and provision UN-backed legal aid. The day ended on a hopeful note with a resolution combining immediate action and long-term reforms for global human rights protection.



United Nations Emergency Children's Fund (UNICEF)

Building on the progress of Day One, delegates drafted resolutions on child rehabilitation and education in post-conflict areas. Key Proposals included mobile health units, trauma-informed schools, and increased funding for child welfare initiatives. The final resolution was widely praised for its inclusive and practical approach, showcasing a united, solution-driven effort by the committee.



United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP)

Day Two saw UNEP delegates intensifying their focus on climate resilience and environmental financing. Final discussions revolved around clean-tech transfer, climate reparations, and capacity building for developing nations. The committee successfully passed a comprehensive resolution advocating global carbon audit systems and the formation of stronger international green alliances. Delegates left the room with a renewed sense of urgency and responsibility toward safeguarding our planet.
